Rules and Conduct of the Competition: Unless otherwise stated in this Announcement, the Albuquerque CoolLOOP® Open will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the 2011 Official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook, the changes and revisions approved by the Governing Council, and all updates/corrections posted on the U.S. Figure Skating website. Events will be separate, and there will be no final rounds. All events will be judged under the 6.0 system.

Eligibility: The competition is open to all eligible skaters who are members in good standing of U.S. Figure Skating and foreign nationals who are members in good standing with their own National Associations, in accordance with Rule 3056.

Entries/Deadline/Refunds: Competition entries **must be received by May 28, 2011. We will not accept entries that require signature for delivery.** Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Referee and the Competition Committee and only if accompanied by a \$30 late fee. The Competition Committee reserves the right to limit entries in any event or to cancel any event due to time restrictions. Entry fees will not be refunded after May 28, 2011 unless an event entered is canceled. Two entries will constitute an event. For purposes of this paragraph, skating against the book or an exhibition or a critique skated pursuant to a skater's choice if there are no other entries will also constitute an event.

Facility: Outpost Ice Arena has two indoor ice surfaces measuring 85' x 196' with rounded corners and two connecting ice surfaces measuring approximately 30' x 128'. A snack bar and pro shop will be available. Spectator seating is also available, and no admission will be charged.

Liability: U.S. Figure Skating and the Albuquerque Figure Skating Club undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skaters or officials. As a condition of, and in consideration of the acceptance of their entries or participation, all entrants, their parents and guardians, and officials shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks of injury to their person and property resulting from, caused by, or connected with, the conduct and management of the competition, and to waive and release any and all claims which they may have against any officials, U.S. Figure Skating, the Albuquerque Figure Skating Club, and against its officers. Entries shall be accepted only on such condition.

Registration: The registration desk will be open in the lobby of the Outpost Ice Arena Friday evening, July 8th and prior to the beginning of the events on Saturday, July 9th. Specific times will be provided with your notification of event and practice ice times.

Practice Ice: Practice ice will be available starting Friday evening, July 8th. Depending on the size of the competition, additional practice ice may be scheduled on Friday afternoon. Practice ice will cost \$12.00 for each 20-minute session. See Registration form for more information. We cannot guarantee that practice ice will be on the same ice surface as the skater's event. Practice ice fees will not be refunded after May 28, 2011 unless an event entered is canceled.

Awards: Awards will be made as soon as possible after the conclusion of each event. Medals will be given to the top 4 skaters in each event.

Photography: Personal cameras will be permitted in the awards area and bleachers only and may not be plugged into arena outlets. Flash photography is permitted in the awards area only. No flash photography is permitted in the arena.

Music: All Freeskate and Artistic competitors must provide their own music on a CD-R. Tapes and CD-RW will not be accepted. CDs must be plainly marked with the competitor's name and event. Only one track may be recorded. A spare CD must be readily available for emergencies. Music must be turned in at time of registration. Music will not be played on practice ice.

Advertisements: We welcome program advertising. Deadline for camera-ready ads is May 28, 2011. Please see page 12 for details.

Official Notices: An Official Bulletin Board will be maintained at Outpost Ice Arena. Each competitor and coach is expected to check this board for the official times of events and/or changes in schedules. Notices posted on the Official Bulletin Board will be considered sufficient notice to all competitors, parents, professionals, and officials. Competitors should check in with the Ice Monitor forty-five (45) minutes prior to the scheduled time of their events. Events may run up to 15 minutes early without posting notice of a schedule change.

Please provide an email address so we may notify you of event and practice ice times. If you wish to be notified by mail, you must include a self-addressed stamped letter-sized envelope. If no email address or stamped envelope is provided, you will not be notified. The Practice Ice and Competition schedule will be posted as soon as each is available on our website at www.abqfsc.org/aclo.htm. A service charge of \$30.00 will be added to any returned checks. Payment by money order or cash covering fees and service charge will be required in these cases.

COMPETITION EVENTS

Two entries in a division will constitute a competition. Pre-preliminary through Pre-Juvenile events will be grouped by age, depending on number of entries. Juvenile entries will be grouped as set forth in the 2011 Rulebook. Adult events may be separated by the age groups stated in Rule 3292 at the discretion of the referee. Initial skating order will be determined by random draw. If, after exercise of discretion granted to the Referee or the Competition Committee to combine entrants to make events, there remains only one skater in an event, the skater will be contacted and may elect to perform an Exhibition or a Critique or skate against the Book without refund or have the event cancelled with refund. The Competition Committee

reserves the right to limit entries for each event or to cancel an entire event due to time constraints. Entries will be processed as they are received.

For events with testing requirements, unless otherwise stated in this Announcement, skaters may compete in events both at their free skate test level and one level above their free skate test level but may not skate down in any event. Skaters who have not previously tested may compete at the Pre-Preliminary / Pre-Bronze level. Event eligibility is based on age and test status as of May 28, 2011.

FREESKATING

The competition committee may combine boys and girls Limited Pre-Preliminary through Open Preliminary to make events.

* Skaters 21 and over who have passed standard FS tests at the Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, or Juvenile levels may be able to skate in the Adult Bronze, Silver, or Gold events. See Rules 3800, 3790, and 3780. Skaters 21 and over may skate in the Adult Open event regardless of test level

SHORT PROGRAM

Juvenile and Open Juvenile short program events will be offered and will consist of the program requirements for the Intermediate short program, as specified in Rules 3670-3671. Age and test requirements are the same as Freeskating, above.

COMPULSORY MOVES

Age and test requirements for Pre-Preliminary through Juvenile are the same as Freeskating. Age requirement for Adult levels is at least 21 years. Test requirements/restrictions for Adult levels are as stated below. Compulsory moves will be skated without music. Required moves may be done in any order, without stops between elements. Additional or repeated elements and excessive footwork will be penalized. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between the jumps. An axel is considered a single jump. Required individual jumps may not be repeated as part of the combination jump. The competition committee may combine male and female entrants to make events.

Adult Team Compulsory Moves

Events in this category consist of four required elements skated by teams of two skaters of the same gender. Skaters will be judged as a team. A team may consist of a low level and a high level skater, in which case the team must compete at the high level.

Events will be conducted as follows: Skaters in each team will enter the ice together when introduced. One skater will take his or her beginning position on the ice while the partner takes an unobtrusive, safe position by the boards. At the signal to begin, the first skater will skate any two of the required elements and will then skate to the entrance gate. As the first skater returns to the entrance gate, the second skater will skate into the view of the judges and perform the remaining two required elements without waiting for a signal to begin. Each skater may join his or her elements with appropriate connecting steps, but connecting steps will not affect the team's score. When the final element is concluded, the first skater will join his or partner, and the skaters will exit the ice together.

Skaters may not coach, cheer, or communicate with each other once they have been given the signal to begin. Additionally, the second skater may not practice or "walk through" elements while on the ice waiting to skate. Any of the foregoing conduct will be cause for disqualification of the team.

All events will be skated on half ice with no music. Maximum time from the signal to begin until the conclusion of the final element is 1:30.

Low (Pre-Bronze test level: Rule 3805 or no test passed)	Waltz jump; single toe loop; forward upright one or two foot spin (min. 3 revolutions.); forward spiral (may be on a flat without penalty).
High (Bronze, silver, and gold test levels: Rule 3780, 3790, or 3800)	Single loop; jump combination consisting of two single jumps, one of which must be a toe loop (Axels not permitted); forward sit spin (min. 4 revolutions.); layback or attitude spin (min. 4 revolutions.).

SPINS

Age and test requirements for Pre-Preliminary through Juvenile are the same as Freeskating. Age and test requirements for Adult levels are the same as Compulsory Moves. Spins must be skated exactly as stated, but may be performed in any order and may be joined by appropriate connecting steps. However, connecting steps will not affect your score. All levels will be skated on half ice without music. The Competition Committee may combine male and female entrants to make events.

ADULT JUMPS

Age and test requirements are the same as Compulsory Moves. Jumps must be skated exactly as stated and in the order in which they are listed. However, the order of the jumps in a combination jump is optional (ex.: double/single or single/double). Only the stroking and edges necessary to prepare for the jump are permitted. Extra moves and excessive connecting steps will be penalized. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between the jumps.

The event will be conducted as follows: At the conclusion of the warm-up period, the first skater will perform the first jump twice, followed by the second jump twice, and third jump (if any) twice. Skaters will be judged on the better performance of each jump. The process will be repeated for the remaining skaters. If a skater is given a choice of jumps to be performed, the first attempt will determine the jump to be judged, *i.e.*, the skater may not change jumps on the second attempt.

ARTISTIC – QUALIFIER FOR NATIONAL SHOWCASE

Skaters placing fourth and higher in a preliminary or higher contested singles event in the Artistic Category will qualify for the 2012 National Showcase competition if they also meet test level requirements. Duets and ensembles are not required to qualify in order to compete at the National Showcase. For additional information, contact Melissa Bowman, National Vice-Chair for National Showcase at patinage_tx@verizon.net.

Ladies and men will compete together in artistic events. Test restrictions state the highest test level permitted. Skaters may compete at their test level and/or any level above their test level. Vocal music is permitted. Performances will be judged from an entertainment standpoint, for theatrical and artistic qualities. Technical skating skills and difficulty will not be rewarded as such; however, skating must be the major element of the performance and be of sufficient quality to support the selected theatrical elements. Unintended falls, poorly executed skating elements and obvious losses of control will reduce contestant's marks. Theatrical elements evaluated will include energy, poise, acting, pantomime, eye contact, choreography, form/extension and the use of props and ice.

Costumes should reflect the character of the music, be in good taste, and not present a safety hazard to the skater or others. Hand held and/or on-ice props that meet the following restrictions may be used. A hand held prop is one that the skater can hold and skate with. The prop may be placed on the ice and/or picked up by the skater at any point in the program. Props must not present a danger to the skater, the ice surface, or any other person or property. A skater may not use live props, fire, water, smoke, explosives of any nature, or any other item that could cause a change in the ice surface or present a hazard. If a prop is to be on the ice at the beginning of a skater's program, the skater may take only 10 seconds from the time his or her name is called to set up the prop on the ice surface, and the skater must push or carry it on and off the ice without assistance. No debris may be left on the ice. Only hand held props that do not impede other skaters may be used on practice ice and warm up.

Artistic Singles Freeskating (See page 9 for Artistic Duets)

Dramatic and Light events will be offered at each level. However, dramatic and light programs may be combined to make events. The Chief Referee and Competition Committee may elect to combine men's and ladies' entries **and/or levels** due to limited entries.

Artistic Duets

Level One	1:40	No higher than Juvenile FS. Under 21.
Level Two	2:10	Intermediate or higher FS. Under 21.
Open Adult	2:10	No test requirements. At least 21.

A duet may consist of a Level One and a Level Two skater. Such a duet must enter the Level Two event. Levels and ages may be combined to make events. If a Level Two Duet is combined with a Level One or an Open Adult Duet, the maximum time for the event will be 2:10. The difference in length of programs will not be a factor in marking the combined event.

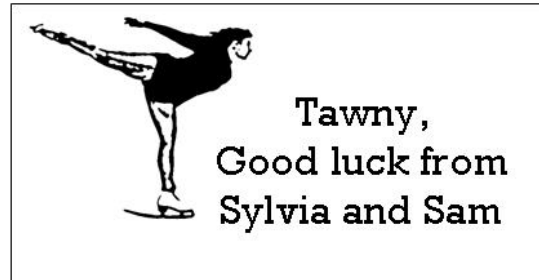
